## Trophy Challenge Round 2 Underway

For the second round of the trophy challenge, students will still need to get a minimum number of trophies in order to get an in-class grade. The three different subjects students need to get their trophies in are **Math, Reading, and Language Arts**. Due to Round Two of the trophy challenge being significantly shorter, the number of trophies and percentage of the overall grade will be lower.

For Round Two, students in Kindergarten through Second Grade will still be able to earn extra credit. Students in these grade levels will not be able to earn gift cards however.

Students in Third through Eight Grades will still be able to earn both extra credit and gift cards. The Target gift card amounts remain the same as they did in the first challenge even though they only have to earn 13 trophies rather than 21. \$5 for the first subject, \$5 for the second subject, and \$20 for all three subjects.

# Exact Path Trophy Challenge FAQ!

## 1. Why are we doing this? Does Principal Roll hate us? 🤔

Da Vinci Tree Academy does not teach to the state test, so it is important that our students have a special tool that help them prepare. The state test is unlike anything else we normally do in school.

## 2. Why does Mr. Roll think Exact Path may help students on their state test? 🤔

Mr. Roll thinks this for several reasons, all of which are data related:

- A. US Department of Education measures how well a specific preparatory program help kids. Exact Path is at a level two on the ESSA Tiered Evidence system<sup>1</sup> and meets the 2022 What Works Clearing House design standards with reservations.<sup>2</sup>
- B. With a sampling of around 10,000 real Arizona students who used Exact Path benchmarking in 2023, a clear correlation can be seen between how a student performed in Exact Path and how they did on the state test.<sup>3</sup> This helps us target certain subjects with specific kids.
- C. An independent government study in 2018 on the previous state test showed that Exact Path helped increase student scores between 2 and 7.5 percentiles.<sup>4</sup>
- D. A study commissioned by Edmentum that was outsourced to a group of three researchers from 2022-2023 found positive test increases in those who used Exact Path from 17%-27%.<sup>5</sup>

## 3. Some of these questions are horrible! It is like they want to test kids over how carefully they can read directions, not whether or not they learned the academics!

Yes! Exactly! That is the way the state test has been written in the past. Hopefully, by experiencing this in their trophy challenge they will be ready for it on the test. We agree that these questions often do not do a great job testing whether or not the kids know the content.

## 4. Math seems okay, but Reading and Language Arts are very poorly worded. Why does Da Vinci use this tool when the questions are so frustrating?

Exact Path is patterned after the state test. **If the state test is frustrating and poorly worded, then so are the Exact Path questions which are deliberately written to mirror it.** Again, we are simply

trying to prepare our students for the test using a tool that is similar to the test. We agree that these questions are frustrating and no fun.

## 5. Research shows that too much screen time is bad for children's development. Why doesn't Da Vinci use a paper based test prep tool?

Many of our classrooms supplement the Exact Path test prep with paper-based or group-based work. **The fact remains that the state test will be on the iPad, so our test prep is on the iPad as well.**

## 6. I hear that Edmentum is stealing our students' data and selling it. Why is the school allowing that?

Edmentum is not stealing your student's data. The school pays for the service. The service has typical ad trackers and cookies to save passwords and the like, but no student privacy violations or student monetization activities (in the form of tracking for ads) are taking place.<sup>6</sup>

## 7. I heard that the school isn't allowed to set up services like this for my student without me agreeing to it. Is Exact Path therefore illegal?

This one seems pretty far fetched, but several people have asked about it. Page 11 of our enrollment document takes care of this. Additionally, the judicial doctrine of *in loco parentis* also probably covers the school in this matter. Newer laws such as COPPA (Children's Online Privacy Protection Act) do not apply to Edmentum as the service is not surreptitiously collecting and selling student data. Older laws such as FERPA (Federal Educational Rights and Privacy Act) also do not apply to this as Edmentum only has the most basic directory data on our students and keeps this information behind privacy barriers that are consistent with the law and online best practices.

## 8. What if in the end it doesn't help our kids?

Then we won't use it next year. We used a school-wide test prep tool last year that didn't help us, so we scrapped it and switched to Exact Path.

## 9. I work and I don't have time to do Exact Path with my kids. Isn't this whole thing unfair to working parents?

Most kids can do Exact Path on their own. If not, Da Vinci Tree provides the following for you:

- Free, daily after-school tutoring from 3:45-5:00.
- Free, weekly online tutoring that can your student can do anywhere with an internet connection (this is only for a limited time).
- Affordable (\$10) Saturday School every Saturday from 10-noon.
